Survey Objectives:

1. Contents

1-1 Content description

This survey provides detailed data on the various characteristics of individuals in general, and on the demographic, social and economic characteristics of economically active individuals (employed and unemployed), and characteristics of economically non-active individuals.

2-1 variables

Variables include the following:

- Identification data per individual
- Demographic data
- Educational data
- Economic data

3-1 Definitions

Employed: Is the individual aged (15+), who has worked or is working in either the government sector or the private sector (formal or informal) and Working hours should not be less than one hour during the seven days preceding the day of the interview. The concept of Employed has been narrowed according to the new methodology of the labor force survey by excluding unpaid workers from the definition of the Employed ,as they were considered in the previous methodology (2016 and before) as Employed.

Unemployed: Is the individual aged 15+, who is able to work, not engaged in any work, available for work and seeking for a job?

The unemployed individual must fulfill the following conditions:

- **a.** He should not be engaged in any work (currently unemployed): His /Her Working hours should not be less than one hour during the seven days preceding the day of the interview, and is not temporarily absent from work.
- **b. Available for work:** He/she should be ready to be hired immediately during the week preceding the interview or during the fifteen days following it.
- **C. Job Seeker:** / He/she has taken specific steps to search for apart –time or permanent job in a certain close period during the four weeks preceding the day of the interview.

Economically inactive (population outside the labor force): Individuals aged 15+ who are not working and not seeking for a job, such as students, housekeepers, sick individuals, elderly, retired people and those with fixed income.

Economically active (population within the labor force): Individuals aged 15+ who are employed or unemployed.

4-1 Classifications (basis of details in the tables)

Published tables are based on publishing the data according to the field collection, processing and dissemination of data.

2- Sample survey

This survey is carried out on a sample of families with a size of (16,560) families distributed over all governorates of the Kingdom. The sample was designed using a two-stage stratified cluster sampling method, so that the results are representative at the level of the Kingdom, urban, rural, regions and governorates.
